To celebrate reaching the milestone of 100 issues of Architectural Review Australia we thought it a good time to step back from the cut and thrust of current practice and take a moment to acknowledge those built projects that represent some of the highest achievements in Australian architecture from the last quarter of a century.


To this end we launched a survey in February inviting architects, photographers, academics and architectural commentators to nominate their 'top live' pieces of architecture, as well as one person who they believe has been of significant influence to Australian architecture in the last 25 years.

The following pages represent the results of this survey, including comments and quotes from the respondents who have nominated projects. In generating this survey we approached almost 1000 architectural professionals from around the country, resulting in 586 nominations that have been consolidated into the results that follow.


Image 1 on this page indicates the regional spread of respondents, with New South Wales and Victoria not surprisingly comprising the largest segments of response. We were also pleased however to receive responses from Oueensland, Western Australia, the Australian Capital Territory. South Australia, Tasmania and the Northern Territory. One interesting observation relates to regional preferences, where 69% of all respondents from around the country nominated projects built within the state from which the nomination came.

image 2 represents the spread of projects nominated by type; residential, institutional/public commercial and other projects, illustrating that residential work, though often small in scale, remains an especially important area of architectural investigation.
